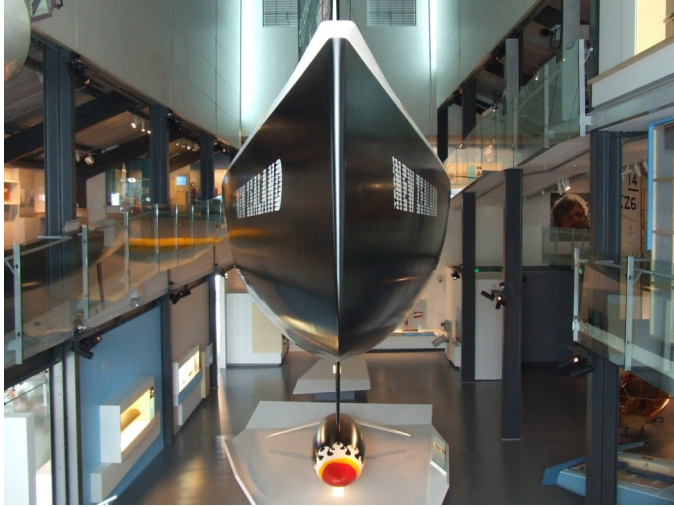


Blue Water Black Magic - A Tribute to Sir Peter Blake

Voyager New Zealand Maritime Museum



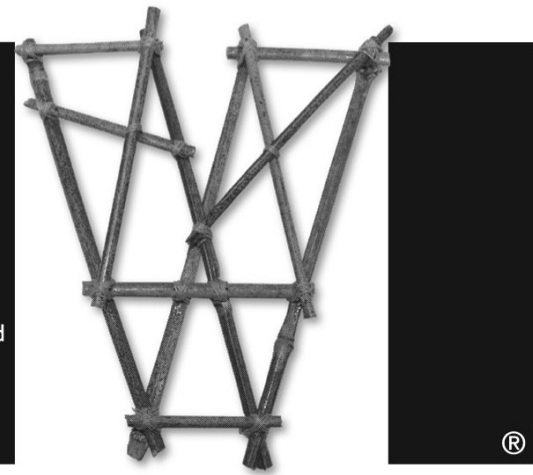

Course Information

Participants will complete theory modules each morning at Voyager, followed by a practical activity in the afternoon.

- Sail on Voyager's sailing scow, Ted Ashby
- Visit the Marine Rescue Centre
- Visit the Westpac Helicopter Trust Base
- Ferry trip to Devonport

Boating experience is not a prerequisite but an interest in maritime activities is recommended.

The programme is ideal for students who are considering careers in the maritime world as well as recreational boating.

At the end of the course, students will have:

- Attained NZ Day Skipper Certificate with Unit Standard 6915 Level 1 & 2 credits.
- Completed both on and off the water tutorials with accredited tutors.
- Participated in on the water sailing experiences.
- Visited a variety of commercial maritime operations.
