Discover how people of the Pacific are utilising their knowledge and values to revive traditional voyaging. Learn how Pacific knowledge and values can support a sustainable future for our people and the oceans*

***This programme celebrates the incredible knowledge and kaupapa surrounding waka. The significance of waka (canoes) for Māori has its roots in times past, when voyaging waka forged the links between the ancestral homeland of Hawaiki and Aotearoa New Zealand. Waka link together all of the peoples of Polynesia and the Pacific. Through the values of waka and people we seek to explore how we can live sustainably together. We work in partnership with the Te Toki Voyaging Trust. Their mission is the revitalisation of waka culture and knowledge within the Pacific; protecting the environment, promoting awareness of the oceans, pollution and climate change.***



### Programme overview

This unique programme is delivered by experienced NZ classroom teachers and the well travelled waka whanau of Te Toki Voyaging Trust.

Your programme will be tailored to suit your learning programme at school. Themes may include:

- Migration
- Sustainable oceans and energy sources
- Leadership
- Pacific seafaring- navigation, waka design

Programme activities may include

- 2 hour waka experience (depending on class sizes)
- On-land programme to discover some of the technologies/skills and stories behind the Great Pacific Migration or caring for our oceans
- Self guided trail exploring the galleries of Hui Te Ananui A Tangaroa, the New Zealand Maritime Museum
